Anti Terror or Anti Free Press? Brutal repression against independent journalists

SOCEPP: The repressive regime of Meles Zenaw has decreed a convenient anti terrorism law that is invoking to justify its repression against free journalist and all political dissidents. The so called law is such that a mild critic of the regime qualifies as terrorism. To help along, the regime has decreed quite a few journalists as terrorists even though some of them have no army or armed group or have never engaged in actions that can remotely be associated with terrorism.

Reeyot Alemu & Woubshet Taye are journalists jailed by the repressive regime and accused of being members of a terrorist organization. Woubshet has been brutally tortured in an attempt to force him to expose "his accomplices".
